In spite of the pandemic, we continued to give back, while honoring the legacy of former NJPGA President Peter A. Famiano through a Memorial Scholarship for junior golfers that showcase professionalism, integrity, volunteerism, and willingness to help others; and the Bruce Lieberman Memorial Scholarship given annually to student-athletes that excel both academically and athletical-

New Look Golf In Schools Program Seeks Partnerships with Local Clubs/Facilities

The NJGF operates one of the nation's most prolific Golf In Schools programs, impacting more than 120,000 children (K-8th grade) at more than 200 schools in New Jersey each year.



Golf In Schools introduces the game of golf to children, by incorporating it into the physical education curriculum at elementary and middle schools. To support this initiative, the NJGF provides each school with an allotment of equipment that allows golf to be learned and played in non-traditional venues, such as a school gymnasium and limited-space outdoor areas. While golf programming was canceled in 2021 due to COVID-19, plans call for golf to return to the physical education curriculum across the state.

Prior to the nationwide shutdown, the NJGF team enjoyed the opportunity to present the Golf in Schools Program to dozens of Physical Education teachers at the NJAHPERD Annual Convention. Future plans call for the NJGF to implementa golf facility sponsor program, essentially matching schools with partner golf facilities in their regions, to extend the Golf In Schools program, beyond gym class, with adhering to all local and state health and safety protocols.

This new program enables a golf facility to "sponsor" a local school while further supporting the NJGF's on-going commitment to player development programs. This new look program will offer more potential opportunities for the boys & girls to experience clinics and play days at the partner facility.

After School Programming - Father English

rian Dobbie, PGA Professional at Trump Nation-Dal Golf Club Bedminster, is passionate about opening new doors for boys and girls that excel in the classroom, and the after-school golf program at Father English Community Center has become a sought after activity for kids in Paterson. Thankfully, COVID-19 did not shut down this 6-week player development program, offered as a reward to select students based on their performance in the "Virtual" classroom. While Dobbie had to adapt the sessions to follow new safety protocols, it was a pleasure to see the kids active and teeing it up. Each year, more than 20,000 boys & girls (K-8) in Paterson are introduced to the game of golf in physical education class. While the Golf In Schools program was cancelled this year, the Father English after-school program delivered an opportunity for kids to continue their golf development with the hopes of sparking greater interest in the game.





PGA Junior League Golf presented by RWJBarnabas Health

Despite the initial economic shutdown due to the global pandemic, a series of new operational procedures and best practices were established to support a safe return to the golf course.



More than 520 boys and girls (13-and-under) participated in PGA Junior League Golf, presented by RWJBarnabas Health in New Jersey this season. To complement the 13-and-under age group, another 50 boys and girls competed in the 17-and-under division, as 46 teams represented 27 facilities across all age groups.

Through this program, kids have a unique opportunity to stay active, while learning and enjoying the game of golf in a fun and social environment alongside their friends (socially distanced) - under the direction of PGA and LPGA Professionals. Similar to other youth sports, kids wear numbered jerseys and play on teams with friends, while the two-person

scramble format is designed to accommodate players of all skill levels.

The Section Championship took place at Fiddlers Elbow CC on September 2nd, as the Bergen 1 All-Star Team, captained by PGA Professional, Mark Thornewell, from Haworth

Country Club, captured the 2020 PGAJL Section Championship.

Currently, there are 132 active PGA HOPE program locations nationwide, positively impacting more than 2,500 military Veterans each year. More than 350 PGA Members have been trained to specifically train Veterans.

The HOPE program is also championed by 20 PGA HOPE Veteran Ambassadors who have graduated from local PGA HOPE programs and participated in the four-day advanced golf instruction and wellness training program at Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Md., as part of the 2019


NJPGA Professionals Lace 'em Up against Philadelphia PGA Professionals in Charitable Hockey Game
